High Light Houseplants

More light provides more food for plants, you just need to be careful of the intensity of the light for certain plants. Most homes don't provide a full days worth of light but a bright room is enough for a plant to be happy and thrive. Higher variegation and repeat blooms occur with higher light.

What is high light?

• South or West facing window up to 4-6 feet max. Be careful of direct rays hitting foliage, this can cause burning. A light weight sheer covering the window is good way to create indirect light.
